Gallery Rifle Update

Irish Open County Kildare.

The Irish open was attended by five of the Scotland squad who competed as individuals under the banner of Gallery Rifle Scotland. For all it was the first venture over to Ireland to compete in what is the largest shooting competition over the water, attended by over 260 competitors coming in from all parts of Europe. Great help was given by the Irish club processing the required FA visitor's passes, they basically handled the process in its entirety. Traveling to Southern Ireland via England then Wales to avoid the extra paper work required within Northern Ireland made it a long haul and possibly we need to take the short cut next time. The competition was extremely enjoyable with the Scot's mixing well and taking advantage of the local hospitality and opening hours.

For a first attendance great success was had, the squad returned with two rifle class wins and extraordinarily Johnny Cormie taking a win in two events, competing using borrowed kit in two of the most popular events an amazing achievement. The Irish open is a must do for 2015 and hopefully more of us will head over to the Harbour House range. Expect to enjoy the local banter and a big welcome from the Irish.

National Gallery competition Bisley 23- 24 August.

Seventeen member squad headed south to compete in the 2014 Gallery Rifle national event at Bisley.

This year we formed very strong five person teams for both centre fire and small bore in accordance with the rules of no shooter participating in both. We also for the first time completed in a Home countries national match revolver and pistol match again entering two five person teams. The rifle matches where we form two five person teams offer the most challenges for us. Encouragingly although we came third this year, seeing the gap between the National team scores reduce again to a margin of less than 1%. The teams confidence is at an all time high and its only a matter of time until the skill levels shown during practice transpose into the arena of competition. Knowing that the Scotland squad possessed some of the top pistol and revolver shooters in the UK we supported the discussion of extending the Home counties national event to include Long barrel revolver and pistol matches. We saw at this year's Nationals the home countries of England, Wales and Scotland complete for titles for the first time and as anticipated we saw Scotland shoot not to its full potential but certainly well enough to secure the revolver title and coming a close second to Wales, by only three points in the pistol event. Individual success also came to many of the squad including a new British record.

Winter Grand Prix series

With the turn of the leaves it's time for the start of the winter Grand Prix series. This year there are a few exciting developments from previous years. Due to the high demand for firing points, the decision was made to run two of the competitions over two days to double the number for firing points available. In addition to this, the opportunity to use electronic targets has arisen. The competitions at Denwood, Carlisle and Glenrothes (Nov, Jan and Feb respectively) will be run on the same weekends as the SSRA grand prixs so that we can use the electronics the day before or after their rifle matches. This is an excellent chance to get get a bit of practice on the electronic targets before the Scottish Championships in the spring. Entry forms can be found on the website. Air Weapons Licensing

As many of you will be aware, the Scottish Parliament has prepared a bill which includes 'air weapon licensing'. The SPA has written a response to this which outlines the potential consequences of the bill which could fatally damage the grassroots of the sport and project a negative stigma on the sport through the terminology of 'air weapons' rather than 'airguns'. The response submitted points out the dangers of over stretching the police force to enable to processing of the thousands of license applications which could be detriment to the goal of reducing crime. It also stresses that there are not enough airgun clubs in Scotland to cope with the influx of members which would inevitably arise due to

the restrictions in the bill of where airgun training can take place. Along with the impact on young shooters trying to enter the sport and the difficulty in policing visitor permits with no border control, the fact that gun



safety and awareness training is given to youngsters using airguns, therefore enhancing their understanding and safety around firearms was outlined. The Scottish Police Federation has also submitted a response which supports the idea of stricter controls on airguns but outlines the difficulties and restrictions which are caused by the bill. They highlight that the bill will highly

likely result in an increase in work being generated for officers working the in licensing department which could not be provided without significant disruption. The Scottish Police Federation have asked for further clarification on a number of issues including, further clarity on the extra staff required to facilitate the proposed



licensing system, confirmation that the current ICT system will have the capacity and functionality required along with requests for further information on costs and time required amongst other uncertainties. Club Profiles

In this edition we have introduced a section on Club Profiles and thanks to Balerno and Currie agreeing to be first! Next edition will be Bearsden's turn.

Balerno & Currie Rifle Club

This club is situated in the west of Edinburgh, in Currie, about 25 minutes from the city centre. It was formed in 1945 from the local Home Guard Company, as were many clubs around that time. Until 1976 the range was an old nissen hut. Thankfully, the building of the by-pass and the wishes of the Council meant that it was removed and with financial help from many quarters, including the 35 members, a new range was built in the present

location. Further improvements have been made over the years and we now have a club that has an armoury, two ranges and a club room with a small kitchen.

One of the ranges has 8 firing points for .22 prone rifle and the other has 4 firing points for air guns at 10m and 1 firing point for 20yards. When the club is running an open meeting, the 'air range' can be converted to another 8 firing point .22 range. On these occasions, obviously there is no air shooting, but we can take part in all the fun by helping in the kitchen (they sometimes have pies left over) or just laughing at all the kit these poor people have to cart around with them!

The club is run by a committee and is open every Monday and Friday from 7pm till 10pm, with senior club members taking about 3 turns per year as the duty officer, being responsible for taking range fees and selling ammunition.

Among the club members we have the SSRA squad coach, 2 ISSF Jury , 1 ISSF Class 'C' Judge, NSRA range officers, scorers and club instructors.

The club, or the SPA will run courses whenever there is sufficient demand.

At the moment, we have 6 people shooting air pistol in the club. We shoot in the Cumbria and Northumbria Postal League and in some of the SPA postal

competitions. We have just received a grant which has enabled us to purchase 2 new Steyr LP2 compact pistols, so anyone thinking of trying air pistol has

something decent to shoot with. We've even got one of the pistols with a 'Universal' grip, so if you shoot lefthanded, this is the one for you!
